Washington, DC – Benjamin Corb has been named Membership and Public Affairs Manager at the American Institute for Medical and Biological Engineering. He is responsible for retention and recruitment of organizational and individual members for AIMBE, oversees the Institute's external communications, and builds alliances and business opportunities with a wide range of third parties.

AIMBE was founded in 1991 to establish a clear and comprehensive identity for the field of medical and biological engineering - the bridge between the principles of engineering science and practice, and the problems and issues of biological and medical science and practice.

Corb previously served as both the Acting Executive Director and Senior Technical Coordinator at the Next Generation Air Transportation System (NextGen) Institute, which is laying the groundwork for a massive rebuilding of U.S. air traffic control technologies to deal with the explosive growth in commercial air traffic. He also has managed the civil aeronautics portfolio for the Government Affairs Office of the American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics (AIAA) and was part of the Department of Veteran Affairs' Office of Asset Enterprise Management, where he helped draft the VA's Energy Conservation Program Guidance in 2003
